Spring Safety Checklist for Warehousing Employers

Facility & Equipment Maintenance

✓ Inspect warehouse floors for cracks, potholes, or uneven surfaces caused by winter damage.
✓ Check for leaks in the roof and walls, especially after heavy rains.
✓ Ensure loading dock doors, bay doors, and roll-up doors are functioning properly.
✓ Clean and inspect HVAC systems to improve air quality and prevent overheating.
✓ Inspect racking systems for stability, rust, or damage from winter conditions.
✓ Ensure proper lighting in aisles, dock areas, and outdoor spaces.
✓ Remove any standing water near entryways to prevent slips.

Worker Safety & Training

✓ Secure outdoor storage items that could be affected by wind or rain.
✓ Verify truck restraints, wheel chocks, and dock seals are in working order.

Inventory & Material Handling

	Review and update storage procedures to account for seasonal product changes.
	Inspect shelves and storage racks for overloading or shifting materials.
	Ensure proper ventilation in areas storing chemicals or hazardous materials.

Emergency Preparedness

Review and update warehouse emergency action plans for severe weather events.
Test emergency lighting, alarms, and backup power sources.

Conduct seasonal safety meetings to remind employees of weather-related risks.
